

Introduction

We have conducted a benchmarking exercise to compare Walter Halls Primary and Early Years School with 14 statistical national schools to understand whether the school is demonstrating value for money in public spending. The school is an average-sized primary school. Pupils eligible for free school meals at any time during the last 6 years is approximately 38.3% which is higher than average (25.5%)

Interpreting the data



Staff costs




Total Teaching Staff costs




Senior Leadership Team (FTE)




Total Number of Teachers (FTE)




Agency Supply Teaching Costs




Total Education Support Staff Costs




Total Number of Teaching Assistants (FTE)




